President's Report

In 2025, Mosman Netball Club continued to build upon the success that was 2024. We welcomed new members to the Committee, and continued to ensure that we provided a safe, welcoming and encouraging environment for our players and families.

We began the season with our popular Wake Up Netball sessions for all our Junior players which lead into our Grading programme for all players including our Inters. The Season Kick-Off enables all players to collect their 2025 training shirts - a first for a number of years, meet their teams and coaches, select a team manager and try on uniforms to purchase through our new uniform supplier, Academy Sportswear.

Our results in the NSNA Winter Competition were excellent. Mosman Netball Club was the most successful Community Club in this competition. Six of our teams brought home the Championship trophy - 10A, 10D, 11A, 13A, 15A and Inters 1. We were particularly proud of our 15A team, who won every Championship Trophy since the 10As.

Of our 21 Junior teams, 16 secured a spot in the finals series and 8 teams made it all the way to the Grand Final. Five of our teams brought home the winners' trophies. Of our 10 Seniors and Inters teams, we had 3 teams in the finals series and 2 teams made it to the Grand Finals, with the Inters 1 team taking home the Championship trophy.

Additional achievements at Mosman Netball Club this year include:

- We continued our investment in our Player Development and Coaching Program for the 6th year.
- We introduced remunerated coaching for all our teams in the U10s to U13s age groups.
- We saw our highest ever number of Mosman juniors selected (34 players) for NSNA State and Development squads. This is the highest number of any club in the NSNA and accounts for almost 40% of all participants.
- We invested further in our Umpiring Program, seeing a total of 28 umpire levels awarded to Mosman umpires.
- We continued our Coaching Apprentice Program for the fourth year, with four graduates now ready to take up head coach positions in 2026.
- We ran two successful Introduction to Netball programs.
- We ran a successful Summer Netball Competition, which has encouraged new membership in 2026.
- We held the most successful fundraising event in the history of the Club - a Trivia Night held at The Buena.

- We continued to grow our social media presence across Facebook and Instagram.
- We finished the season with a successful Presentation Day.

The 2025 Winter season was not without its challenges with the NSNA introducing e-scoring and multiple venues for some of our Senior players.

CLUB OVERVIEW

1. Senior Teams

Seniors continue to be an important part of our Club, not only by offering social teams an opportunity to play but also by fostering a competitive environment for our A1, A2, A4 and Intermediate 1 teams.

Intermediates is a growing competition for school aged participants aged from 15 to 18 years of age. Inters 1 completed a fantastic season - not losing a game and taking out the Grand Final win. Inters 2 finished the season mid field and Inters 3 and 6 had challenging seasons, but took to the court each week and made our Club proud with their passion for the game.

Our A2 team, undefeated during the regular season, came up short during the Grand Final - but not to be disheartened, they are looking forward to hitting the court again in 2026. Our A1 team finished fifth with our teams in B1 and C2 enjoying solid seasons.

2. Junior Teams

Our Junior division continued to achieve in 2025. We had 21 Junior teams across players aged from U10 to U15, which was slightly down from 26 teams in 2024.

The strength of our Coaching and Development program lays an exceptionally strong foundation for our Club and provides exciting pathways for our aspirational players.

This year also saw the introduction of remunerated coaching for our U10s - U13s age groups. As a result, we saw some excellent results for the Club in 2025, including:

- Mosman Netball Club brought home the Championship trophy in the 10As, 10Ds, 11As, 13As and 15As.
- 16 teams secured a spot in the finals series and eight teams made it all the way to the Grand Final.
- 34 Mosman Junior players were selected for the NSNA representative program.

Holly Howison did an excellent job as VP Juniors. She carried out her role with enthusiasm, commitment, compassion and attention to detail and is always an active advocate for our players.

Holly will step down as VP of Juniors and will hand over the role to Alison Francis for the 2026 season.

Thank you Holly for all your hard work and commitment! You did an amazing job managing Grounds Duty, introducing e-scoring and staying on top of the multiple venues for our players.

3. NetSetGo (NSG)

NetSetGo enjoyed a great 2025 season with 77 players (slightly down from 79 in 2024). We had 4 x U8 and 4 x U9 teams, which when aggregated equaled the same number of teams as 2024.

The success of our Australian Socceroos in 2024 saw a decline in NSG registrations across all NSNA clubs. MNC continues to be the largest NetSetGo Club for NSNA. There continues to be great success with age/peer-based training and the specialist coaching program continues to provide invaluable expertise to our volunteer parent coaches, both on training and match days.

Our Specialist sessions with each team and their coach on a rotation basis continued to be received extremely well.

A big thank you to all our parent volunteers who coach and umpire every week, and are helping our new players develop a love for netball.

A huge thank you to Hollie Shukri who was our VP NetSetGo for 2025. Thank you for all your hard work and commitment with putting teams together and supporting the players and parents.

We welcome Sophie Dent to the VP NetSetGo role for the 2026 season.

4. Introduction to Netball (Net Set Prep)

Our Introduction to Netball program was offered for 8 weeks in Terms 2 and 3. The target age for this program is 5 to 7 years of age, to introduce essential netball skills prior to playing in the Summer competition and onwards to NetSetGo.

This operates on the same day as NetSetGo training, so that players already know what day Club training is. Players are encouraged to form teams and play in the Summer competition prior to registering for NetSetGo the following year.

In 2025, we had 35 participants in Term 2 and 21 participants in Term 3. This was an increase from a total of 47 in 2024.

We see this program as an important part of our Club offering, in particular for encouraging new players to netball and hopefully funnelling them into becoming NetSetGo and Junior members of the future.

Thank you to our Coaching Directors, Craig Marsh and Tracey Chahwan, for their enthusiasm and patience in running this program.

5. Summer Competition

Summer netball competition was successfully run over 8 weeks in Term 4 and continues to be a successful fundraiser for the Club. We had 241 registered players which was down from 272 registered players in 2024.

As in previous years, games were split between Spit West Reserve and Cross St Mosman. The U6s to U8s playing at Spit West and the U9s to U11s playing at Cross St. The Club continues to allow non-members to join the competition, which resulted in players joining from other Clubs nearby.

Each team was required to nominate volunteers to assist Committee volunteers to run the BBQ selling sausage sandwiches, bags of lollies and soft drinks to raise funds for the Club. Additionally, umpires were supplied for the Cross Street games, while parent volunteers umpired the games at the courts at Spit West.

It was another successful summer competition with positive feedback from the players and parents.

Thank you to the Committee and Fenella Burns, who took over running the Summer competition from Lisa Gard and helped ensure everything ran smoothly and all players had a great time. And thank you also to all our parent volunteers who helped out.

6. Coaching and Player Development

Coaching and player development plays a major part in providing a successful and enjoyable netball experience - often providing the basis for life long friendships. Our investment in our Player Development and Coaching Program continues to be a critical part of our Club's offering.

We continued our partnership with Nets Netball, who continue to provide solid foundational skill-based learning to our players. Players and coaches are developed along the curriculum pathway with learning principles recommended by Netball Australia.

2025 saw the introduction of remunerated coaching for the U10 - U13s age groups, and this will be expanded to cover the U14s in 2026 and U15s in 2027. This means more qualified coaching for players at a point where learning technical and team strategies can make all the difference to a player's future opportunities. We also plan to introduce remunerated coaching for our NSG players in 2026.

2025 was the fourth year of our Coach Apprentice Program. We now have several graduates who are looking to take up head coach positions in 2026.

We thank Craig Marsh and Tracey Chahwan for another excellent and successful year partnering with the Club. The results on the court are a testament to the hard work and commitment they provide our Club.

7. Umpires

Our Umpiring Program continues to thrive. In 2025, we saw a total of 28 umpire levels awarded to Mosman umpires. including 13 Junior Level 3 and 7 Junior Level 1 awards.

Our mentor program assisted 16 new Umpires in commencing their Umpiring pathway. The formal mentoring program continued to prove successful, with Umpires feeling strong and confident.

Thank you to mentors Jemma, Keira, Emilia, Leah, Lucia and Jaime for their support of their Umpires in 2025.

In the 2025 Season, two Mosman Umpires represented Northern Suburbs and umpired for NSNA at various Representative Carnivals. One Mosman Umpire was selected to Umpire at NSW State Titles by NSNA and the Netball NSW Summer Series competition.

We also had two complete umpiring for Representative Trials and these two Umpires will be in a good place to obtain their C badges in 2026.

Huge thanks to Marianne Sharp who has dedicated so much time to supporting our umpires over the past 12 months. Marianne will be continuing as Senior Umpiring Convenor in 2026, supported by Jemma Michell as Junior Umpiring Convenor.

8. Events

Our Events team has done an outstanding job in 2025. It was fantastic to see the team spirit and Club camaraderie lifted by our events held in 2025. These included:

- Season kick-off event. This included a formal welcome from the President and was an opportunity for teams to meet each other, to introduce Committee members and Coaches, set expectations for training/game attendance, explain Stack Team App and give an overview of the role of Team Manager, with a view to recruiting managers on the day. Players also received their training shirts - which was a first in many years. Fundraising activities were in full swing with a sausage sizzle, soft drinks and lolly bags available to purchase on the day. We also held a second hand uniform sale encouraging sustainability by passing on old uniforms to our younger players. We also had our uniform supplier on site to enable players to try on uniforms and merchandise before purchasing through our online ordering system.
- Club outing to watch the Sydney Derby - Swifts v Giants at Ken Rosewall Arena at Homebush - we had a block booking and around 200 members of the Club headed out to support their favourite NSW team. It was a great atmosphere and it was agreed that we should try to repeat this outing in 2026.
- Club Fundraiser - we held a Trivia Night at The Buena. It was attended by around 150 guests and raised well-needed funds for the Club, through ticket sales, exclusive raffle of wine and a gorgeous pair of earrings generously donated by Harper Jewellery, onsite auction and games organised by the Trivia host. It ended with an overall profit of over \$20,000 from the event. This was up from \$12,000 from 2024.
- Presentation Day - once again our NSG and Juniors Presentation Day was a resounding success. It featured a BBQ, lolly bags, bake sale and Tombola and helped end the season on a high. We also had hair spray and nail painting booths and garden games on offer.
- Summer Competition BBQ - we once again ran a BBQ to raise funds during our Summer competition evenings at Cross Street.

Thank you to our Events Team Eva Heaton and Natalie Schofield for all their hard work and dedication to the cause this year.

9. Treasurer's Report

Mosman Netball Club is a not-for-profit organisation, with any surplus funds being reinvested into the Club. There are no distributions made to members.

Full financial results can be seen in the Treasurer's Report, with the following highlights.

The Club made significant improvements in profitability with a solid profit of \$59,000. This is up 194% from 2024, reflecting the Club's ongoing commitment to financial sustainability and growth.

The Club's positive financial performance was driven by substantial growth in both sponsorship and fundraising income. Sponsorship for 2025 increased by 63% and fundraising efforts increased by an impressive 167%. The focus for 2026 and beyond should be to grow Sponsorship income through strategic partnerships, continue with fundraising efforts and continue to apply for Grants throughout the year.

The Club's largest operating expenses remain the Coaching and Development program, court hire, and administration.

A massive thank you to Lorraine Mushambadope who continues to do a fabulous job as Treasurer and will continue in the role for 2026.

10. Sponsorship

11. Uniforms

For the 2025 season, we entered into a new agreement with a new uniform supplier - Academy Sportswear. Academy not only supplies our playing uniforms and training shirts, they also supply our merchandise which has been a successful addition to the Mosman Netball Club offering.

The relationship with Academy has been positive. The agreement with Academy allows for a new income-making stream for the Club through percentage of sales from uniforms and Club merchandise.

Thank you to Jess Christopher who has looked after our relationship with Academy this year and to Sophie Klaas who spearheaded the move to Academy and has done an amazing job setting up our new uniforms for 2025.

12. Sustainability

In 2025 we continued with our approach to seeking donations of old, good quality uniforms to provide an affordable uniform supply option for our players. We operate a second hand uniform sale each year at our Season Kick-Off event.

We also donated all our remaining 2024 new and donated second hand training shirts to Kit Bags For Good. Kit Bags For Good source high quality sports kits and equipment to deliver to children and sporting Clubs in need. We will continue this approach in 2026.

13. Administration

In 2025, we welcomed Lisa Gard to the role of Administrator. She hit the ground running to ensure the Club ran smoothly. In August 2025, Lisa sadly resigned from the role and we appointed Samantha Costin to the role.

Thank you Lisa and welcome Samantha. It is a big role to undertake and we appreciate all the hard work and effort you both have put into the role.

14. Committee

I am grateful for our fabulous committee, who have supported me throughout the year. Every member of our committee has worked tirelessly to provide our players with the best experience. I thank them for their time, effort and energy.

Treasurer's Report

Financial overview

We concluded the year with a solid profit of \$59,000, a remarkable improvement from the previous year's profit of \$20,000 in 2024. This represents a robust increase of 194% year-on-year, reflecting the club's ongoing commitment to financial sustainability and growth.

Revenue growth

The club's positive financial performance was primarily driven by substantial growth in both sponsorship and fundraising income. Sponsorship income rose by 63%, while fundraising efforts yielded an impressive 167% increase. These achievements have contributed significantly to our financial stability, positioning us well to establish a strong financial buffer against potential future disruptions, such as those experienced during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Major expenditure areas

As anticipated, our three largest expense categories were the extensive coaching programme, led by Craig and Tracy, court hire from the local council in Mosman, and the salary for our club administrator. Although overall expenses increased by 4% compared to 2024, this modest rise was more than offset by the substantial growth in revenue, ensuring the club's strong financial position remains intact.

Our A2 side, undefeated in the regular season, came up a little short in the big one - they can't wait to get back on court in 2026. A1 finished 5th with our other teams in B1 and C2 enjoying solid seasons.

In 2026 we look forward to further expansion of our senior ranks as more juniors flow through from our U15s and Inters 1 teams.

Junior Division Report

MNC registered 21 Junior teams in the 2025 season, down from 26 teams in 2024.

We registered:

- 6 10s teams (a Club record) (9-10 players each)
- 4 11s teams (9-10 players each)
- 3 12s teams (10 players each)
- 4 13s teams (9 Players each)
- 2 14s teams (10 players each)
- 2 15s teams (9 players each).

Some players who were eligible to play in the 15s were asked to move up to the Inters Competition as we did not have enough registrations to form a third 15s team. There were numerous discussions with the parents involved but in the end it was well received.

MNC was the most successful community netball club in the NSNA Juniors' Winter Competition. Five of our Juniors' teams brought home the winners' trophies – 10A, 10D, 11A, 13A and 15A and Inters 1. Special mention to the 15A team who have been undefeated winning 5 championships.

The 2025 netball season was a season of firsts. It was the first year of multi venue playing and the introduction of e-scoring.

After numerous meetings and emails throughout January 2025 between Northern Suburbs Netball Association (**NSNA**) and all the Clubs, including MNC, it was decided to have a multi venue competition to accommodate works at the Willoughby Leisure Centre, which would last the entire winter netball season. Games were played at Loreto Kirribilli to ensure the fixture would work given there were less courts available to be used for the winter competition at Willoughby. It was also initially raised by NSNA that the 10s competition would be moved to a Sunday but this was refuted by all Clubs and later discarded as an option.

For the first time in the NSNA competition, e-scoring was introduced. This required considerable behind the scenes work by myself and the Administrator, Lisa Gard to ensure it ran smoothly from MNC's point of view. We provided instruction and training for those that were nominating themselves from our Juniors' teams as e-scorers and attended NSNA training sessions ourselves. We were one of the only Clubs to implement it from inception and consistently use e-scoring throughout the season and this was formally recognised by NSNA in an email to myself. It is a great initiative by NSNA and well received by MNC.

MNC Grading

Attendance at grading was strong with most registered players able to attend both sessions. I conducted an informal verbal survey of parents as they arrived at grading with their players with most commenting that they had been given sufficient information about grading times and dates.

Grading for 10-12s players was held across two Sundays in February and 13-15s trialled in one afternoon session later in the month.

Given the large number of registered players across the 10-12s, it worked well again this season (like 2024 season) having the second grading session broken up into two ability groups, with a crossover of half an hour in the middle to finalise teams for the middle grades.

The independent and professional nature of the grading panel and process meant that we received few complaints from parents about team placement. Craig and Tracey knew the players well and confidently placed players into skill-appropriate teams.

Decisions needed to be made with some age groups in regards to player numbers per team, taking into consideration paid coaching, court time and the perceived lack of need to attend if teams have nine (or more) players.

Season Kick-off

The Season Kick off event was held on Saturday 1 March 2025 and provided an opportunity for players to meet their team, receive their training shirts and ask any questions of MNC Committee members, coaches and managers. It was great that the training shirts were ready for this event.

The event was well planned this year with Net Set Go held between 1:30pm-3:00pm and then Juniors after a half an hour break from 3:30pm-5:00pm. Similarly to previous Presentation Days, players sat in their teams, with parents at the back of the hall, for a formal welcome by the President. It was an opportunity to introduce new committee members and coaches, set expectations for training/game attendance, explain Stack Team App and give an overview of the role of Team Manager, with a view to recruiting managers on the day.

Grounds Duty

Each season all Clubs are rostered on for Grounds Duty – an obligatory duty-imposed by NSNA.

Unfortunately this season our first round of Grounds Duty was held after the Easter holidays. It was an arduous task to find volunteers for the day. I sent out a very clear schedule of duties and timeslots that were provided to all Team Managers who were then asked to find volunteers from their team for their allocated duties. Few Team Managers responded to my numerous emails asking for volunteers until a few days before the allocated day. On the day of Grounds Duty many volunteers who had signed up did not show up and I was left covering most of the duties from about 11am until the last game. Thankfully NSNA told me it was the most well run Grounds Duty they had seen – but it meant I was left doing most of the duties.

The organisation of Grounds Duty may need to be reviewed for the 2026 season- hopefully it falls at a better time of the year.

NSNA Representative Program - Mosman Players

Considerations for the 2026 season

Overall, player attendance and commitment to training and games was good this season. Player attendance at all training sessions and games was recorded.

At the beginning of the season there were a number of issues regarding attendance at Friday games clashing with school debating, with parents signing their children up to both with no intention of attending the game for the first few weeks of the season. In the 2026 season it should be made clear that parents must choose between either school debating or netball.

1. Paid coaching was well received by our players and parents and should remain a part of MNC.
2. Registrations should continue to be closed prior to grading and only opened for registrations where we need to fill age groups. Everyone else joins a waitlist.

3. We will continue to communicate the expectation that players will attend all training sessions and games. This will be done in pre-season newsletters, at grading, at season kick-off, by coaches at training and in newsletters throughout the season.
4. We will continue to communicate the expectation that anticipated absences as well as absences due to unexpected illness or injury will be communicated to coaches and managers in a timely fashion.
5. The awards for 15s players who have been playing for Mosman for over five years was well received and should be continued next season.
6. E-scoring information should be provided as soon as teams are announced to ensure we have volunteer e-scorers for each team ready to go from game 1.
7. The importance of MNC fulfilling its Grounds Duty obligations imposed by NSNA should continue to be communicated to all members once we receive our dates for the season. It should not only be the responsibility of Team Managers to fulfil that duty nor the VP, Juniors.

NetSetGo Division Report

MNC had a great year for our NetSetGo division, completing a full season of netball with 12 rounds, fortunately we only had two washed out rounds this year compared to four in 2024.

We were pleased to have had 77 registered players across eight teams, which was equal to the number of teams in 2023. The success of our Australian Socceroo's in 2024 saw a decline in NSG registrations across all NSNA clubs. In summary, in 2025 we had 4 x U8 teams and 4 x U9 teams. MNC continues to be the largest NetSetGo Club for NSNA.

NSG members range from 7-9yrs of age across two age divisions U8 and U9. Both age divisions trained on a Tuesday afternoon, U8 from 4:00pm to 5:15pm and U9 5:15pm – 6:30pm. The coaching department continues to provide invaluable expertise to our parent volunteer coaches.

At training in 2025 our coaching department introduced specialist sessions with each team and their coach on a rotation basis. This was received extremely well and gave the coaches an opportunity to step back and watch on, and gave them insight into what they could focus on in their upcoming sessions. The coaching department also checked in with the teams and coaches a couple of times a season on game day.

Volunteers were strongly encouraged to attend the NetSetGo Red Robin Umpire session held at Willoughby in March 2025. This session is held by the NSNA Umpire Convenors and should continue to be the only NSG Umpire course offered to old and new MNC volunteer umpires.

Grading for MNC NetSetGo teams went well and we managed to have an even spread of teams across all grades. MNC had teams in Div A, Division B, Division F, Division H, Division I and Division J. NSNA removed the public disclosure of scoring in 2025. Three of the MNC teams played at 11am, one at 10am and our four U8 teams at 9am.

The Mosman end of season Presentation Day held in September 2025 is such an important day to celebrate the NetSetGo season and as always was a success. NSG players received participation certificates, new U8 and U9 players received their MNC plaques and returning MNC players their decal to add to their plaque. Each team nominated one player for a Spirited Award and the Coach of the Year Award went to Hollie Shukri.

I would suggest for the 2025 season that we communicate to NSG teams the importance of their attendance at the End of Season Presentation Day. We did see a

full team not show up and some award winners were absent. A suggestion would be to notify parents prior that their child will be winning an award, which we hope would encourage greater attendance.

Coaching & Player Development Report

Coaching and Player Development plays a major part in providing a successful and enjoyable Netball experience - often it's life changing and provides the basis for life lasting friendships. Our focus is to provide that experience overlaid with solid foundational skill-based learning. Players and coaches are developed using a curriculum pathway packed with learning principles recommended by Netball Australia.

After 7 seasons, the results of this approach are very apparent on the netball court - particularly when observing other Clubs in the Northern Suburbs Netball Competition. Regardless of team and player grading, player skill levels are typically stronger and teams perform better where they are appropriately graded.

Helping Coaches achieve a level of recognised Coach Accreditation has been a key focus over the past 4 seasons - we now offer fully accredited coaches on all Junior teams 10-14 years with an aim to expand coverage to the U15s and then down into our Net Set Go Competition teams.

2025 saw the expansion of remunerated coaching for the U10 - U14s age groups, this will be expanded to cover the U15s in 2026. This means more qualified coaching for players at a point where learning technical and team strategies can make all the difference to a player's future opportunity. Game enjoyment is important and our aim is to deliver better player and parent satisfaction levels when it comes to skill fundamentals. Regardless of talent we are providing better coaching across all grades.

2025 saw our 4th season of the coach apprentice program, real progress is being made and sustainable value is becoming more apparent - in 2026 we will see at least 4 graduates take on team coaching roles through this program.

Our Coaching Directors are on-hand at training sessions and match days to guide and mentor all Coaches with the mix of Players, Parents and DOE Coaches coming together to inspire and support our players.

Within our online Coaches Locker Room, coaches have complete access to comprehensive session plans, video demonstrations and the ability to engage directly with the Directors of Coaching - this builds confidence as we provide further detailed information and support in the field. Combined face-to-face mentoring and monthly Zoom meetings provide a strong support network to deliver excellent opportunity, development and continuous improvement for all players and coaches.

Congratulations to our joint Coaches of the year award winners. Juniors - Fenella Burns and Astrid Durrant. In Net Set Go, Holy Shukri. Amazing work from these super coaches.

Mosman Netball Club continues to lead the way as one of the best Club Netball experiences in the National Netball Community.

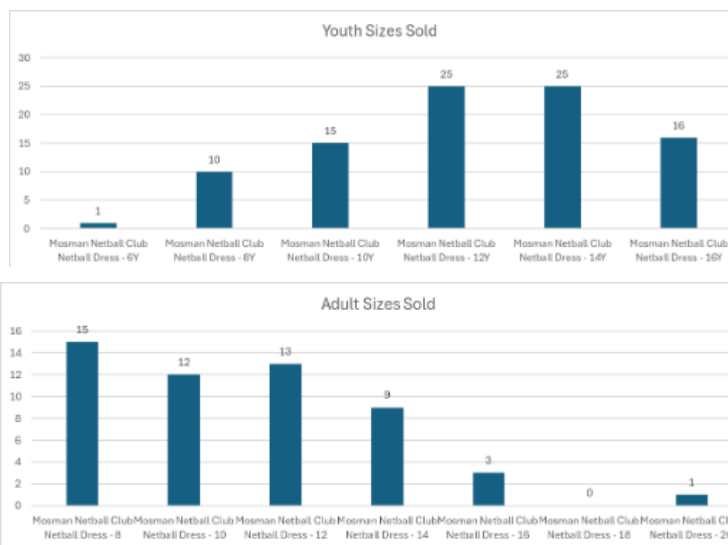

Dresses

We redesigned the playing dress and re-sized to address feedback from previous years on sizing outages.



In 2025, we introduced new merchandise including a new hoodie in a grey with pink writing colour way in a style similar to the popular White Fox hoodies, caps, visors, socks, leggings, bags and lycra shorts, along with our popular navy blue zip up hoodie. We sold 396 items across the year (including dresses), which resulted in a total rebate from Academy of \$2,991.88. The majority of sales came through in Q1 at the start of the season, followed by Q2.

To encourage sustainability, we requested our members to donate their good quality, used uniforms that the Club could onsell at a significant discount to players. These items were sold at our second hand uniform sale at our Season Kick Off event.
